IFTAR/DINNER AND SUHOOR

Community Iftar

We had community Iftar/dinners sponsored by generous community members every Friday, Saturday and Sunday. A record number of people attended, with attendance ranging from 750 to 950 people.

Taking into consideration the health and safety of our community, we contracted with local restaurants to cater food for all dinners. Food was served in pre-packaged boxes only.

At \$300 per sponsorship, we had a total of 343 sponsorships; total donations received was \$102,982. *Jazakum Allahu Khairan* to all the sponsors!







First Responder Iftar

On April 9th, the Cedar Park First Responder Team joined us for Iftar/Dinner.

Revert Muslim Iftar

On April 14th, we hosted a special Iftar for our Revert Muslim brothers and sisters. Organized as an exclusive event for Revert Muslims only, about 25 people attended.



Interfaith Iftar

On April 16th, members of the local Church of Latter-Day Saints hosted us for Iftar at their Church. About 25 members led by our Imam Jawad attended.















Suhoor Meals

During the last 9 nights, Suhoor meals were provided at the masjid at the end of *Qiyaam al-Layl* prayers. The meals were sponsored by generous community members and local Muslim-Owned businesses. *Jazakum Allahu Khairan* to the sponsors!





YOUTH PROGRAMS & ACTIVITIES

Masjid Decoration by our Youth

Our youth had decorated the masjid interior and exterior with lighting and appropriate Islamic decorative elements at the start of Ramadan.







Islamic Quiz Contest

We conducted quiz contest daily for our youth every night. The questions were based on Imam Jawad's Khatera from the previous night. Over 80 children and vouth participated. Prizes were awarded to the top performers.





ICBC Kids' Ramadan Journal

Kids 4 and above were encouraged to keep track of their Ramadan activities (daily salah, fasting, tarawih, charity, voluntary work, etc.) to be endorsed by a parent. The iournals were submitted to ICBC at the end of Ramadan and all participating kids were given an award.

















Youth Qiyaam Nights

We had separate Qiyaam nights for Boys (on April 15th) and Girls (on April 14th). The program involved discussion on spirituality relevant to the younger generation, Halaga, Ibadah, Games, About 140 boys and 120 girls the attended separate, all-night sessions.

"Bring Your Youth Friends" Iftar

On April 2nd, our community youth boys and girls hosted an Iftar for their non-Muslim friends.







Bake Sale by Youth

During the blessed month, our youth boys and girls conducted bake sale on April 8th and 9th. Additionally, our Girl Scout team conducted bake sale on April 14th and 15th of the month. About \$9,000 was raised from the sales and matching donations from generous community members. The proceeds were donated to the construction funds of the ICBC Educational & Activities Center (EAC).

Food Distribution

Zakat Al Fitr was established at \$15 for every individual in the household. We collected Zakat Al Fitr funds throughout the month. A total of \$53,662 was received and disbursed to eligible Muslim families in the Greater Austin area.

During the blessed month, several outside organizations—Islamic schools, Masajid, Da'wah groups, Relief organizations, etc., set up tables outside the Masjid during every night and Friday Jumu'ah to appeal for funds for their respective causes. FACILITIES, PARKING AND SECURITY



Families with Special Needs Children

This year, we allocated the Men's Old Masjid for the exclusive use of families with special needs children. There was audio & video feed so the attendees could follow the Imam leading the prayers.



Masjid Cleaning

A professional janitorial services firm was employed to clean the masjid daily during Ramadan, inside and outside twice every day. In addition, a separate cleaning crew was employed to clean outside after Iftar.



Go Green Initiative

AS part of our recently launched ambitious project at our masjid, we adopted/promoted the following initiatives.











In the spirit of environmental conservation, we provided drinking water though water dispensers instead of individual water bottles. We encourage the community members to bring their own reusable water bottles.

Unlike in prior Ramadans, we had minimal water bottles disposed this year. We thank everyone for their support, cooperation, and active participation in this noble initiative.













Security

We contracted with the Cedar Park Police Department (CPPD) to deploy Off-Duty police to provide security at our Center during Friday Jumu'ah prayer times as well as during Tarawih prayers, Community Iftar (Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays), Youth Qiyaam nights, and the five Eid prayer sessions. We used the services of two contracted personnel for traffic control.

Additionally, the Cedar Park Police department had also increased surveillance at our premises throughout the day. May Allah SWT protect us and keep us safe, *Aameen*.



Parking Arrangements

Whereas we are blessed with approx. 220 parking spaces at our Center, we ran out of parking on several days and had to use the in-field lawn area to park ~30 vehicles and secured the land from our next-door neighbor that allowed us to park an additional 70 vehicles. With increased needs, we got permission from the Vista Ridge High School to park vehicles at their parking lot. We arranged a shuttle services to/from VR High School and ICBC. Approx. 100 cars between were parked between the additional locations.

We had secured permission from the Vista Ridge High School (VRHS) to use their parking lot from 9 PM onwards that allowed us to park up to 100 vehicles for those who came for Isha/Taraweeh. We employed shuttle services to/from the Vista Ridge High School to ICBC every 5-10 minutes to facilitate transportation to the masjid.



MASTER PLAN UPDATE AND FUNDRAISING

With the construction of the Educational Activities Center (EAC) in full swing, we presented details of the EAC followed by a fundraiser on April; 15th. The community support was truly overwhelming. We met our target of \$1.6 Million, Alhamdu lillah. Our sincere appreciation to everyone for their generous donations and support. Jazakum Allahu Khairan!
